- Focus on very specific points

- Understand all the information

1.4 Listening for Specific Information

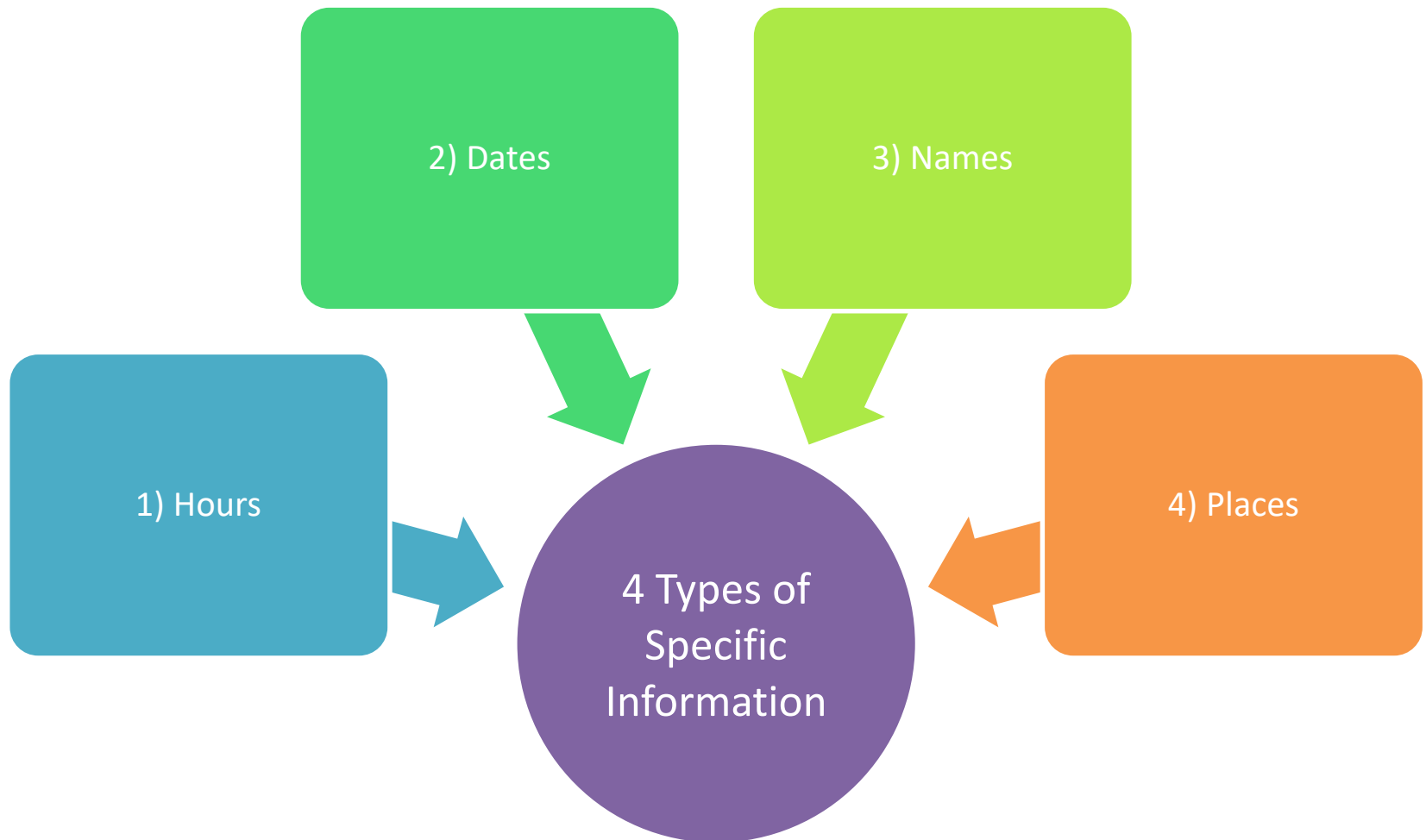
- Be clear about what information you are listening for.
- Look for that specific kind of information.
- Disregard irrelevant details.
- Narrow down important details to get the specific information.
