- Analyse the causes (reasons why something happen) and effects (what happen because of the causes) for/of an action or event.
- Explain the reasons and results for something.
- Aim to inform and convince readers to accept the causes and effects.
- Use professional and factual tone of writing.

- Apply a common method of organising and discussing points.
 - 1) Primary Effects and Causes: most important
 - 2) Contributory Effects and Causes: less important
 - 3) Immediate Effects and Causes: direct or remote

- Introduction
- Background Information + Thesis Statement

P2

- Body Paragraph
- First cause or effect + detailed description & explanation

Р3


- Body Paragraph
- Second cause or effect + detailed description & explanation

P4

- Body Paragraph
- Last cause or effect + detailed description & explanation

P5

- Conclusion
- Restatement of Thesis Statement + Summary



Conclusion

- Organise points effectively.
- Present thesis statement at the beginning of the essay.
- Prepare an outline to ensure the points are clear and concise.
- Practice makes perfect!
