Organisation of An Essay

- * 3 types
- * Support thesis statement with relevant and sufficient elaborations

Chronological Order

* Organise the details according to the events occurred

2. Order of Importance

* Organise the details from most important to least or vice versa

3. Categorical Order

* Organise the details according to parts or categories
