- Able to apply appropriate and accurate language in written communication.




- Provide vivid sensory details of a person, object, event, or place.

- Help readers to connect emotionally and appreciate deeply about the subject.

- Apply a common method of organising and describing details.
 - 1) Spatial Order: order of space
 - 2) Chronological Order: order of time
 - 3) Climactic Order: order of importance
