  - 3) Conclusion
- Support each description with two or three specific details.
- > Explain these specific details adequately.



#### Organisation of An Essay

\* 3 types

\* Support thesis statement with vivid and interesting descriptions

#### 1. Spatial Order

\* Organise the clear details in the order of location(moves likes a movie camera).

#### 2. Chronological Order

\* Organise the clear details in the order of time( moves from scenes by scenes).

#### 3. Climactic Order

\* Organise the clear details in the order of importance(from less important to more important).



Transition Words - to sequence the details effectively. - to link ideas effectively for easy reading. - to blend details smoothly for coherent and cohesion impacts.			
Spatial Order - Next to - Before - Above - Below	Chronological Order - First - Next -Then - Last month - Last year	Climactic Order - Less - More - Main - More important - Most important
