Particle で

- いきます / きます / かえります are verbs of movement. The particle で (by) is put after the vehicle to indicate a means of transportation. The noun preceding で is a vehicle in this case. The question word なん (what) is used to ask by what means of transport you're going.

PARTICLE で

1. N (Vehicle)で いきます/ きます/ かえります。

BUT:

When you walk somewhere, the expression あるいて (on foot) is used. In this case, particle で (by) is not used.

れい /rei (Examples) :

- わたしは バス で きます。
Watashi wa basu **de** kimasu.
(I came by bus.)

- エリカさんはひこうき で いきます。
Erika san wa hikooki **de** ikimasu.
(Ms Erika is going by aeroplane.)

- アズマンさんはでんしゃ で かえります。
Azuman san wa densha **de** kaerimasu.
(Mrs Azuman is return by train.)

れい / rei (Example)

Adam : なん で UMP へ きます か。

Nan de UMP e kimasu ka.

(How do you come to UMP?)

Faris : くるま で きます。

Kuruma de kimasu.

(Come by car)

れい / rei (Example)

Raid : なん で ホステルへ かえりますか。

Nan de hosuteru e kaerimasu ka.

(How do you return to hostel?)

Tajuddin : わたしは あるいて かえります。

Watashi wa aruite kaerimasu.

I walk.

watashi wa enpitsu de tegami wo kakimasu


Meaning: I write letter with the pencil.

- わたしは はし で ごはんをたべます。
watashi wa hashi de gohan wo tabemasu.

Meaning: I eat the meal with the chopsticks.

- わたしは はさみ で かみをきります。
watashi wa hasami de kami wo kirimasu

Meaning: I cut the paper with the scissors.



When you want to mention in a sentence what tool is used in your action, you can use the particle で (de)
