



Type of Cognitive Failure

Capture errors

Description

Your routine captures you and take over an unfamiliar activity.

Example:

At home, your door to enter living need to be pushed. However, at workplace the door needs to be pulled.

You will pushing the door at the workplace couple of times .

Routine activity will capture the execution of new work process –lead to error and injuries



Type of Cognitive Failure

Description

Brain cramps

Due to the descriptions or locator of two different things are similar.

Example:

Similar switches that located nearby each other but the switches control different function. Errors will happen by clicking on the wrong switch.

Can you imagine if you want to switch on down light but you unintentionally switch on the hazardous machine..?



Type of Cognitive Failure

Description

Forgetting.

Loss of activation errors

Example:

Have plan to collect book "A" in a room, suddenly after got into that room, the plan to collect book "A" is suddenly disappear in the mind.

What commonly happen; people will just get out from that room, and do something else.. However, after sometimes they will remember what actually they wanted to do.




One functions such as button control multiple mode of operation.

Tend to have problem by clicking wrong button for wrong of operation.












