Pronunciation

There are 3 sound of letter c in Spanish

- The *c* sound like *k* before a,o,u
- The *c* sound like *s* before e,o,i
- The *ch* in *chum*

Example : **computadora** (computer)

Example : **cinco** (five)

Example : **chocolate**

There are 2 sound of letter g in Spanish

- The *g* sound like *g* before a,o,u
- The *g* sound like *h* before e or i

Example : **garaje** (garage)

Example : **gigante**

Vowel

No sound / silent in Spanish

- Example: **h**ospital (hospital)

J sound like h

- Example : **j**u^{er} (woman)

Vowel

z sound like s

- Example: azul (blue)

V sound like b

- Example : vestido (skirt)

Vowel

// sound like y

- Example: silla (chair)

Ñ sound like ny

- Example : señora (madam)
